TUALATIN HILLS PARK FOUNDATION, PORTLAND TIMBERS LAUNCH CHARITY AUCTION OF FOUR TIMBERS TICKETS

The Tualatin Hills Park Foundation, in partnership with the Portland Timbers, is hosting an online charity auction of a four-ticket package to the Timbers' April 14 MLS game against Chicago at JELD-WEN Field.

The auction is raising money for the Tualatin Hills Park & Recreation District's "Who Should Play" program.

"Through this partnership with the Timbers, the auction will provide a great opportunity to raise money and awareness for the 'Who Should Play' program, which ensures access to programs for all district residents," said THPRD General Manager Doug Menke.

Bidding for the four tickets starts at \$500. The initial deadline for the auction is 6 p.m. on Tuesday, March 29. Bidding is currently under way. The winner will be announced Monday, April 4.
